State-run broadband network to get 10 times faster — Kasich

The state will spend more than \$10 million on upgrades that will increase speeds ten-fold on a state-run broadband network used by universities, schools governments and private businesses, Ohio Gov. <u>John Kasich</u> announced in Tuesday's State of the State address.

The deal with **Cisco Systems Inc.** (NASDAQ: CSCO) and **Juniper Networks Inc.** (NYSE:JNPR) will open up more capacity on <u>OARnet</u>, a more than 1,800-mile fiber optic cable web across the state, increasing speeds to 100 gigabits per second from the current 10 Gbps.

Last fall Hilliard-based GoldTech of Ohio LLC won a \$2 million contract to improve connections between links of the network, helping make way for the new upgrade.

OARnet, short for Ohio Academic Resources Network, since 2003 has been acquiring fiber-optic cable that had been laid by telecommunications companies.

The deal includes \$8.1 million on hardware upgrades connecting Columbus and four other cities by June to the national Internet2 high-speed research network, and Athens and two other cities by October. Another \$2.3 million including private investment goes to establish a research center at **Ohio State University**.
